3b	There is critical reflection on how you used theory, design tools, and processes, and some next steps for this design.	-yes there is a reflection included -nice exploration of OBREDIM as an appropriate design process for the situation as compared to other more flexible approaches -and an interesting oversight of the design not being openly permaculture with all of the collaborators especially considering the context -excellent additional reflection added after my first assessment, some great insights and learnings shared there especially recognising patterns in your design work, and the understanding of a wider use of ethics and principles by potentially bringing them into the design earlier in a more conscious way	
3c	The design shows how design skills and competence have progressed and some next steps for design practice.	-interesting development on your research focus and I get a sense that at this stage you were really getting to grips with the principles and understanding them deeply
